Time Bank Action Group activities

The Time Bank Action Group (TBAG) is a small friendly group of time bank members who meet monthly to plan time bank activities and events. The ideas are coming to fruition—this really is an action group.

Just to remind you here are the main aims of the 'TBAGs'

- Planning activities or events
- To be aware of what's going on and to inform others
- To encourage new members to participate
- Foster social cohesion and networking
- Linking with external groups

What is a Time Bank?

A Time Bank uses an alternative currency - time instead of money. In a time bank, participants earn credits for helping each other - one hour of your time entitles you to an hour of someone else's time.

It's about neighbours helping neighbours and organisations sharing assets and skills. Help can be in many forms - performing practical tasks, befriending someone, running errands, sharing food grown in the garden.

Unlike real money, anyone and everyone can earn time credits - no-one is excluded. Almost everybody - young or old - has something to offer, from making supportive phone calls to neighbours to running small errands.
